Triangle Génération Humanitaire (TGH) is present in Ukraine since November 2015. It operates in conflict-affected locations close to the contact line, where it provides multipurpose vouchers and cash grants to highly vulnerable households.

The past two weeks have witnessed a severe deterioration of the tensions affecting eastern Ukraine. Artillery exchanges between the two parties at conflict have dramatically intensified along the “contact line”, the de facto border which separates the territory under the control of the Ukrainian government and the parts of the Lugansk and Donetsk regions held by the self-proclaimed Republics.

This renewed violence seriously worsens the living conditions of populations exhausted by nearly three years of conflict, and by a particularly harsh winter. Thousands of people are regularly deprived from access to water, electricity or heating, whereas the temperature outside reaches -15°C.

As a contribution to the ongoing efforts from humanitarian agencies to mitigate the consequences of the conflict on populations, and with the help of the Crisis Center of the French Ministry of Foreign Affairs, TGH is assisting over 600 particularly vulnerable families of the town of Avdeevka and its surrounds, through the provision of vouchers granting them with an open access to the commodities available at local grocery shops'. Vouchers are being sent through a mobile money system which allows reaching quickly those in need, while road access for in-kind deliveries is extremely challenging under the current security conditions.
